SUBJECT: COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS BETWEEN COUNTY MENTAL
HEALTH DEPARTMENTS AND REGIONAL CENTERS

The purpose of this policy letter is to encourage mental health departments to collaborate with local Regional Centers in providing appropriate mental health services to dually diagnosed individuals (developmental disability and mental health) that require services by both the county mental health department and the Regional Center.

According to California Welfare and Institutions (W&I) Code, Section 4696, county mental health departments and Regional Centers are required to collaborate, meet on a yearly basis, and establish a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that outlines service delivery. In addition, the MOU is to identify staff to better serve this population. Despite the provisions of this law, this population has been underserved by both service delivery systems.

DMH, the Department of Developmental Services (DDS), the California Mental Health Directors Association (CMHDA), and the Association of Regional Center Agencies (ARCA) have worked collaboratively on the Mental Health Task Force for Persons with Developmental Disabilities in addressing statewide issues for this population. In addition, DDS and DMH are working collaboratively to address this issue (See Enclosure). The recommendation for improving county mental health and regional center collaboration are a direct result of the discussions, in this Task Force. DDS, DMH and all members of the Task Force understand that the collaboration and coordination must occur at the local level to properly serve the often-complex array of services of this population, which typically crosses over traditional established areas of responsibility.

DMH and stakeholder groups are encouraging your leadership to improve outcomes for this population. Please refer to Welfare and Institutions (W&I) Code, Section 4696, or on the web at: <http://www.sen.ca.gov>, under Legislation and Codes links, for further clarification of your agency's responsibilities.
